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About Portgordon Community Trust

Who we are

PCT, a Scottish charity, consists of members and Trustees, with its Constitution being the charity's governing document. This document defines our identity, operations, and charitable objectives.

Initially emerging from the Portgordon Community Harbour Group, Portgordon Village Hall, The Lampie Hoose and Portgordon Post, PCT has expanded its scope of responsibilities within the area.

PCT is committed to achieving the following goals:

- Advancing community development
- Enhancing education
- Promoting arts, heritage, and culture
- Providing relief to those in need
- Offering recreational facilities
- Improving environmental protection
- Advancing public education
- Promoting and providing various forms of training and skills.

What we do

Trustees are appointed by members to oversee the charity's operations. They hold regular meetings to drive the charity's initiatives based on the authority granted to them in the Constitution.

PCT, along with its Community Development Officer, supports various village groups, allowing Trustees and active members to have a degree of autonomy in these areas.

Trustees engage in consultations to determine Portgordon community's objectives and devise community development plans accordingly. They address various emerging issues, such as coordinating with wind farms' community benefit funds.

Meetings are typically held monthly, with a flexible approach that includes online video conferencing and collaborative tools.

How we do it

PCT relies on volunteers to oversee the charity and carry out activities in line with its charitable mission. The existence of PCT hinges on the dedication of these volunteers.

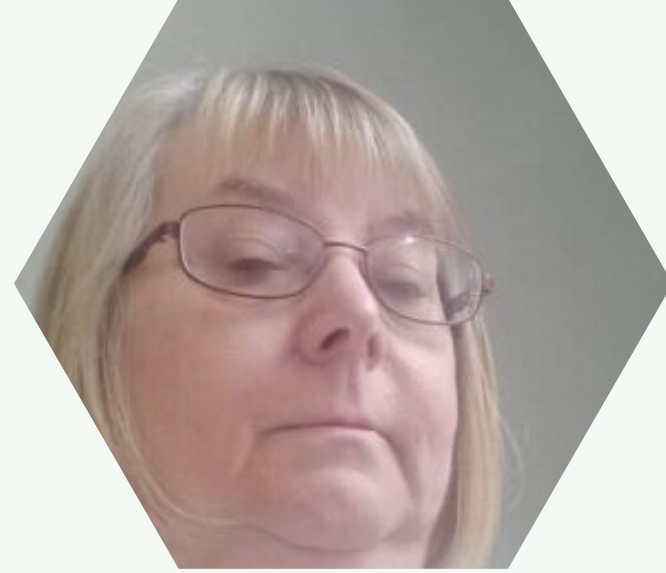
At present, we have a single full-time employee, Michelle Good. The Community Development Officer is tasked with enhancing the organisation's financial sustainability, managing day-to-day operations, and achieving set objectives.

The Richmond Building

Completion of Phase 1, The Richmond Building is now the Trust's Registered Office and the base for our Community Development Officer. Commercial uses on first floor & the two principal rooms can be utilised as meeting rooms or let out as hot desking space on an individual business or co-working model.



With our Cafe now running 3 days a week with a committed gang of volunteers that have undertaken their Food Hygiene Certificate, producing a lovely menu and home bakes. This is a space with a real social focus serving residents of Portgordon and the wider Moray Community, With huge thanks to the Adam Family Foundation who have supported us with essential equipment to allow the café to open.

Working closely with CM Design, we have submitted planning applications for Phase 2 & 3 of the development.

Currently, we are seeking funding for Phase 2 which will see the development of the Harbour Cottage and commercial kitchen.

We appreciate that this is an ambitious project, however, our Business Plan is robust and we are optimistic about gaining planning permission and securing the grant funding necessary to progress this development.

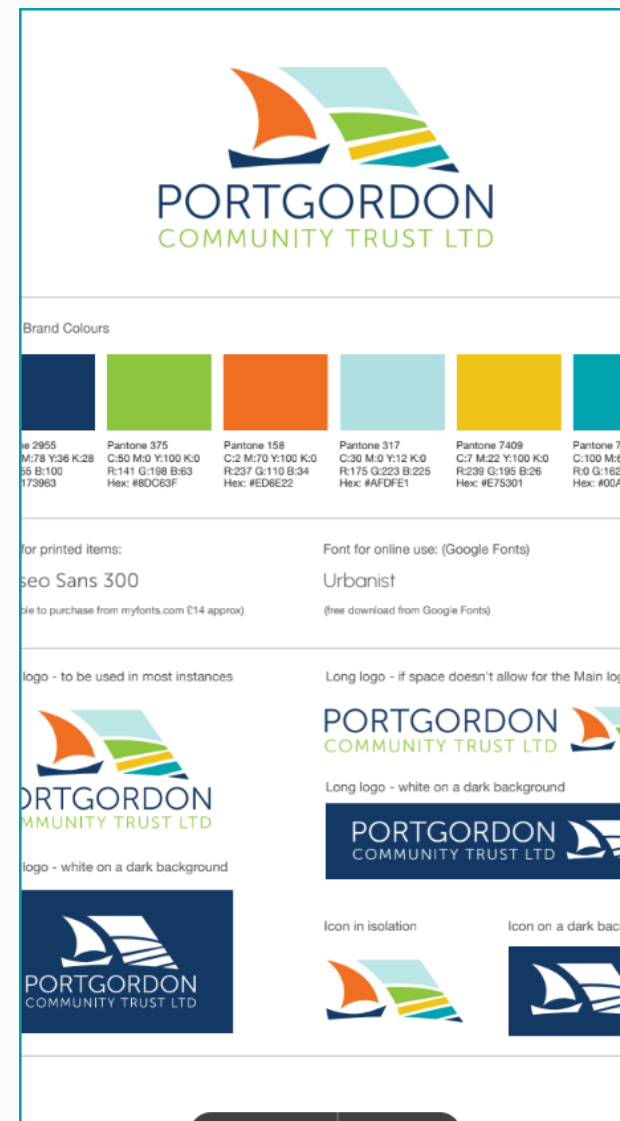
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Recent Successes

We have re-branded

PCT have undergone a rebranding exercise and have relaunched their website and continue to communicate regularly with the community via the Portgordon Post newsletter, Facebook and various Whats App Groups.



The building has undergone significant upgrades, prioritising eco-friendly and cost-efficient systems. Among the improvements made are the instalment of LED lighting, rewiring of the building, the addition of a new fire system, and a new air-to-air source heating system. To celebrate the building's completion, the committee has hosted numerous events, with plans to hold even more in the upcoming year.
